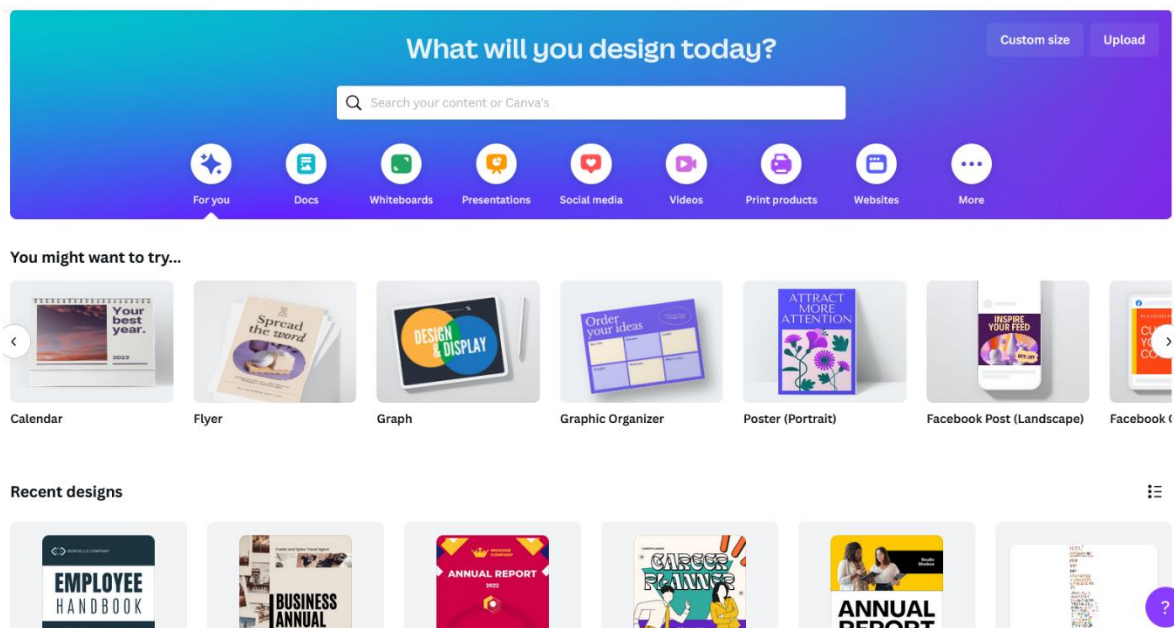

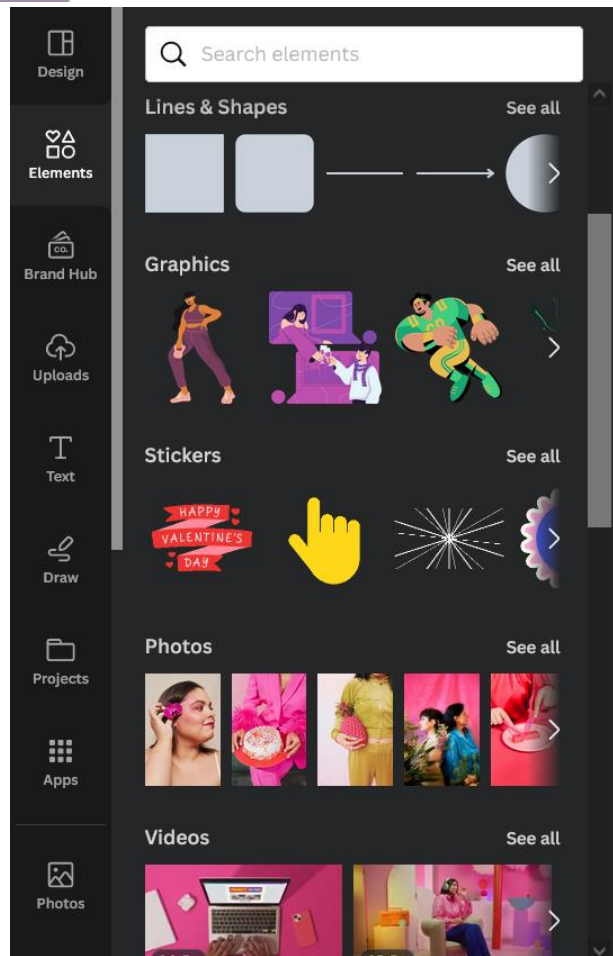
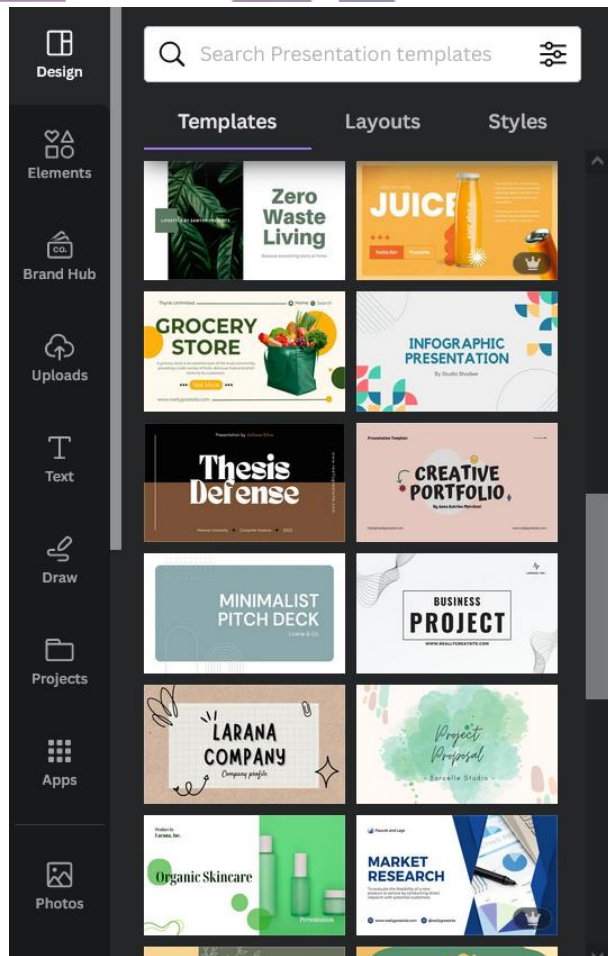

### Description

Canva is an online platform that helps you create graphic content ranging from postcards and posters to videos and even websites. It makes it easy for anyone to create professional, dynamic or animated designs and share or print them.





## Features

Canva is a very diversified, easy-to-use website that provides a large selection of templates, graphic elements, videos and animations to create dynamic designs fitting your needs and wishes.



## Price

There is a free version, a free Pro trial and a paid Pro version with more graphic material and options for 109.99€ a year per person. There is also a possibility of a Team platform to share access with coworkers and collaborators.

## Why using it?

Available in over 100 languages, with over 15 billion designs created since 2013, it is very easy to use and accessible for beginners as it gives a large variety of free pre-made templates and customisable grab-and-go designs, along with many pictures of landscapes, objects, interiors, characters and situations. The Pro version gives you access to over 420,000 templates and 75 million images, videos and elements. Although it does not allow much editing or altering of existing photos, it serves as a great background remover, and many graphics can be modified. The online collaboration features are also very useful for working together on a design or accessing your work from any device.
