

Description

PowerPoint is a very useful and commonly used program among many different fields and professions, which helps you create slideshow presentations with dynamic templates and varied content.





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Features

PowerPoint helps you create presentations composed of slides containing text, pictures, graphics, audio and video content. It proposes various features such as animations which allow you to time and emphasise certain elements, transitions which help make your slideshow fluid, design ideas which organise the content of a slide in an attractive manner, along with the inclusion of audio-visual elements, icons, charts and notes, and the ability to edit images and videos.

Price

There is a free 1-month trial and a paid subscription to Microsoft 365, which includes other Microsoft programs such as Word, Excel and much more, for $69 \in a$ year per person or $99 \in a$ year for up to 6 people.

Why using it?

In order to organise dynamic and interactive activities, you can create presentations, animated graphics or slides to explain different topics or illustrate instructions for games or enigmas. In addition, some enigmas can be created as slides on a tablet or laptop which can be more attractive and motivating. Visual aids, schemes and clear examples can help students stay immersed in the lesson or game as they are used to using screens as guides every day. PowerPoint is quite easy to use and beginners can comfortably create simple presentations with the help of different tools. Microsoft also provides a selection of customisable templates to give colourful and themed examples to use as

inspiration or a basis for your creations.
