The author describes an abstraction of the things to think about when designing a character: their ghost (past trauma), the lie they believe in, the goal they pursue due to the lie, the truth they need to learn to be more fulfilled.

She describes how to choose these elements for a character and how they interact to create the plot. She also explains the different types of character arc: positive arc, negative arc and flat arc.

Most of its content can be accessed for free on the authors' blog.

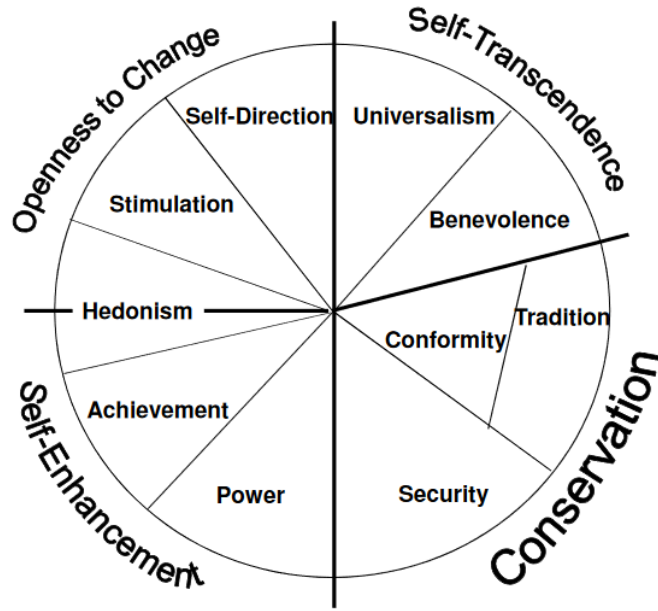
Why using it?
